Pull Apart Christmas Tree Appetizer

- 1 lb. refrigerated pizza dough (tube)
- Egg wash (1 egg whisked with 1 tbsp water)
- 7 mozzarella sticks
- 1/4 c. melted butter
- 1/2 c. finely grated Parmesan
- 1 Tbsp. Thinly sliced basil
- 1 Tbsp. chopped parsley
- 1 Tbsp. chopped rosemary
- Marinara sauce, warmed (for serving)



Step 1:

Preheat oven to 450°. Line a large baking sheet with parchment paper. Cut mozzarella sticks into 1" pieces and set aside.

Step 2:

On a floured surface, divide pizza dough into two pieces. Stretch and roll each piece of dough into a long rectangle, then cut dough into 2" squares (you'll need 33 total).

Step 3:

Wrap a dough square around each piece of mozzarella, forming a tightly sealed ball. Place balls seamside down on the baking sheet in the shape of a Christmas tree (they should be touching). Brush egg wash on dough balls and bake until golden, 15 to 20 minutes.

Step 4:

Meanwhile, whisk together melted butter, Parmesan and herbs. Brush on baked pizza balls. Serve warm with marinara for dipping.
